Highlights of 2010



2010 has seen some of the most interesting river activity for many years. The fact that Mother Nature has seen fit to re-open the old direct navigation channel out to sea makes getting in and out of the marina much easier than it has been for the past 25 years; all the time we have been operating the Marina.

This certainly helped the job of getting the largest vessel to navigate the river since the Manxman left in 1990 into the dock. The 190' / 1400 ton "River Carrier" visited in September to offload a 175 ton electrical transformer for the nearby Howick National Grid station.

The job required us to virtually clear our boatyard so that a 1,000 ton crane could be brought in to do the lift.





We were also visited this Summer by "The Little Brig Sailing Trust", who brought their two mini squareriggers into the Marina for the annual Riversway Festival in July.



As they approached the marina from the river, observers had to do a double-take, as these boats, at only 42' in length created the optical illusion of clipper ships ten times their size appearing to be much further away. Left and above;

Check Your Lines.... As the storm season is now upon us please take the time to double

check your mooring lines and re-enforce them if necessary to make sure your lines don't fail in a blow.

We always try to have a walk round and check lines in windy weather, but ultimately a boat's mooring lines are the berth-holder's responsi-

bility, so please make sure yours are ok.

Pontoon Washing

Over the winter, weather permitting, we will be engaged in cleaning the jetties, so customers are advised to take extra care on the jetties during this time.

As a general precaution in the winter months we would advise that if you do have to venture onto the jetties, please take extra care and wear appropriate footwear.

Winter Water Supply During the winter, we will have to occasionally turn the water supplies to the jetties and the boatyard off when

there is a risk of freezing. Please be wary of this and keep tanks topped up when possible.

Alternatively there is a tap on the marina building near the toilet door that will be kept operational, so you will always have access to water.

The water supply will also be shut off during our short Christmas break from the evening of the 24th December to the 28th December.
