# H.M.S. Charger visit



For the first time in a long time (certainly since the working days of the Port), a Royal Navy vessel, flying the White Ensign, made an official visit to Preston Marina in the impressive shape of H.M.S. Charger - a 68' (20.8m) "Archer" class fast patrol boat.

She was our guest overnight after she arrived from Liverpool on March 19th, with a compliment of trainees from the Liverpool University Royal Navy Unit alongside her regular Royal Navy officers and crew.

The purpose of her visit was to make an assessment on behalf of the Royal Navy as to the recent significant natural improvements to the navigability of the River Ribble which we were very pleased to report in our newsletter of last Spring.

# **More Big Stuff!**

In our previous newsletter we reported on the visit last September of the "River Carrier", at 190' the largest ship to use the dock at Preston for over 20 years in order to deliver a new 175 ton transformer for the National Grid substation in nearby Howick.

This job has been ongoing and required the delivery of 2 more even larger transformers over two weekends in March, again via the river.

This time the heavy RO-RO barge "Terra Marique", towed by the 2.9m draft tug "East" was required to carry the loads each totalling over 500 tons (including 2 wagons and ultra high capacity trailer as well as the transformer itself), which rolled off onto the south bank of the river at high tide on day 2 of each of the 3 day operations.

We hope to see the operation repeated in the future as the Howick National Grid facility continues to develop.

The "new" direct channel across the estuary is remaining constant the marked, straight line approach being of huge benefit to all vessels entering the Ribble.

Charger, which regularly makes similar visits to ports in and around the Irish Sea, had no difficulty with the approach to Preston, and although this particular trip was a "low-key" affair, its success means that we have been assured of more visits from Naval vessel's in the future.

#### "Boil 'n Bake Fruit Cake"

Life onboard does not have to mean you can't enjoy proper cooking and baking, as Hilary from our shop at Preston Marina regularly proves with her fabulous creations straight from the diesel powered oven on their home built sailing yacht.

In this issue, she shares the wonderfully simple recipe for her delicious fruit cake which some of us have been lucky enough to sample on special occasions...

#### Start with...

12 oz. Mixed fruit 1/2 mug sugar 1 mug of milk 4 oz. Margarine

Put the above into a saucepan and gently bring to boil, stirring as you go

#### Then add;

8 oz. Self raising flour (sieved)

2 beaten eggs

1 tsp. Of Baking Powder

1 tsp Bicarbonate of Soda

1 tsp cinnamon, ginger, nutmeg - any spices really!

Mix it all in and bake in a lined tin @ 150° for approx. 1 1/4 hours. Leave in tin to cool....and enjoy!
